- ⇒ This includes registration, housing, meals, a t-shirt, and \$10 per person to **Stop Hunger Now**. Registration is on a first-come, first-served basis.

**\*Session 4 is the best deal! YES— we want to fill July 13-16, so this session offers the air-conditioned hotel rooms for only \$285 (includes \$10 for SHN). Thank-you for helping us fill session 4! No camp option this session.**

### Housing Options

**Hotels and Cottages** include a/c and all linens for \$320— includes \$10 for SHN.

**Camp Massanetta** houses groups in cabins in the wooded camp area. There are 8 beds per cabin and a bathhouse in the village. The cost is \$270— includes \$10 for SHN- and you bring all bed linens and towels. Many love this beautiful option. A great group builder!

### Check-in and Closing

Arrive between **1:00 and 3:30pm**. If your group arrives after 3:30, you will miss important opening activities. Please call the office if you are running late. The conference will end **before lunch** (around 11:00 am) on the last day.

### Adult Advisors

You will need **one** Adult Advisor (21 years or older) for every **seven** youth you bring of each gender.

Adult Advisors are responsible for their group at all times, involved in the Encounter Groups, and are needed to fully participate during the conference.

#### **What to do if you are short an Adult Advisor?**

We are unable to register your group without the ratio of Adult Advisors, but we may be able to help “connect you” with another group that is coming from your area. Please call the Registrar.

### Snail Mail Only

**Please understand that registrations cannot be made by fax, phone, or e-mail but must be mailed in.** We cannot hold spaces for individuals and we can process only those participants with complete fees and forms. **You will be registered only when payment for your group is in full and all forms filled in completely.**

### Scholarships

The offerings received in 2009 will provide scholarships for 2010. If you need assistance for a youth in need, please contact the Director of Program, Laura Holbrook. The funds will be distributed as requests are made and usually for \$100. **Complete the form (on the website) before registering.**

### Refunds

All but a \$25 processing fee per registration is refunded if requested:

- ⇒ before **June 1st, 2010** for the June sessions
- ⇒ before **June 21st, 2010** for the July sessions

### Checks and Credit Cards

Payment by check is preferred, but credit cards are accepted. You may secure your space with a credit card # sent in with your registrations. If a check can follow, this is best for MS and you will not lose your place.

### Child Care

The conference does not offer child care and we are unable to allow under-aged participants. Any child that we would allow would take a space away from a middler as well as divide the attention of the adult advisors.

### Encounter Groups

**Will adults and youth be in the same Encounter Group?**

No, unless your group is larger than 22.

Adults and youth are divided into Encounter Groups based on workshop choices and to balance age, gender, and church representation in each group. This encourages meeting new people. Your group will be together at theme presentations, during meals, and each night at “back home” time.

# Registration Instructions

The following steps should be used as a checklist to be sure that your registration materials are ready to be sent to Massanetta Springs. **Incomplete information will result in your group's entire registration being delayed or returned and could cause you to not get into the session of your choice.** Please review the following procedures and all materials to be sent in for the conference.

- ❑ Photocopy the appropriate number of the **Youth Information Sheets** and photocopy the **Workshop** selections on the back side (please make as many copies as you need).
  - ❑ Photocopy the appropriate number of the **Adult Advisor Information Sheets** and photocopy the **Workshop** selections on the back side (please make as many copies as you need).
  - ❑ Photocopy the appropriate number of the **Registration and Covenant Form**— one for every Adult and Youth Participant.
  - ❑ Distribute the Information Sheets and Registration forms to your youth and adults.
  - ❑ Let everyone know the dates and how much it will cost to go to the conference: the registration fee of \$320 for hotel lodging or \$270 for lodging at Camp Massanetta, OR \$285 for week 4 hotel lodging, (**All** these fees include the \$10 for **Stop Hunger Now**) plus travel and your other expenses. Instruct them to fill out the form completely. **Incomplete forms will delay your group's registration and could cause you to not get into the session of your choice.**
  - ❑ The registration fees increase by \$25 per person if not postmarked by **April 23, 2010**.
  - ❑ **There is no official registration deadline, however, some weeks fill and close in March.**
  - ❑ Have the contact person for your group fill out the Group Contact Person Information Sheet.
  - ❑ Please complete and return the Rooming Preference Form.
  - ❑ Collect the forms and money. Make sure that all of the forms are complete and that youth-to-adult ratios are met (one adult for every seven youth of each gender you bring...there must be a male advisor if you bring male youth and a female advisor if you bring female youth).
  - ❑ Write one check payable to Massanetta Springs, Inc. for the complete fees of all registrants.
  - ❑ Put check, completed Registration Forms for all registrants, the Group Contact Person Information Sheet, and the Rooming Preference Form in an envelope addressed to Massanetta Springs, 712 Massanetta Springs Road, Harrisonburg, VA 22801-8325; ATTN: Middle School Registrar.
- ⇒ Please understand that registrations cannot be made by fax, phone, or e-mail.
- ⇒ If you choose to use a credit card, the # must accompany your forms by mail. We **are** able to hold your space with the credit card # and wait for a check to arrive by mail. Massanetta prefers payment by check.
- ⇒ We cannot hold spaces for individuals and we can process only those participants with complete fees and forms. **Incomplete forms will delay your group's registration and could cause you to not get into the session of your choice.**

# Middle School Conferences Housing and Rooming Preference Form

As our conference has grown we have added other housing options so that more youth are able to come. **There are 2 housing options and costs which should be noted when you register:**

1. Housing in our hotels and cottages: \$320 per person sessions 1, 2, 3 (\$345 after April 23, 2010) or \$285 per person session 4 (\$310 after April 23, 2010); linens/towels provided
2. Housing at Camp Massanetta– cabins with bunks and separate bath houses-you provide linens/towels: \$270 per person (\$295 after April 23, 2010) This is also the rate for church owned cottages at MS.

Because you know your youth best, please help us by placing your youth in suites of rooms using the chart below. At times, a cot will be added to a room so your youth are all able to room together. ***We thank-you in advance*** for being gracious and positive about all our housing.

- The order of receiving the church’s registrations along with the size of the church group determines where groups are housed for those selecting the hotel housing option.
- If assigned in the new Lodge, youth of the same gender may share a queen-sized bed.
- For Camp housing, please list on a separate paper how to place youth– there are 8 beds per cabin.
- A large number of our rooms are suites. A suite is made up of two rooms (each with two twin beds) that have a connecting bathroom.
- All four occupants of the suite must be of the same gender.
- You can choose to fill the suites with a mix of your youth and adult advisors, or your advisors can room in a suite with other adults (from your church and other churches as well).
- Please indicate the adults by writing “Adult Suite” next to their names.
- We will not place one adult with one youth unless you give us permission in writing.

## 180° Workshops

Workshops are opportunities for hands-on experiences that provide ways to interpret and apply the faith concepts that are presented at the worship and theme presentations. Select 5 and list them on the Registration Form.

- 1. LOL.....Life Out Loud:** Do you know people who live their faith OUT LOUD? How can you live YOUR life to make a difference or do a new thing? Come get fired up and fueled up by hearing, seeing, and experiencing stories of those whose lives have done a 180°- and make a 180° story of your own.
- 2. No Degrees of Separation:** One theorist says each person on the planet has only 6° of separation from every other person! But, though we are all on the same planet, we don't all have the same lives, opportunities, or families. This workshop will find ways to love our neighbors, both near and far. *Bead It Up* ~ make bead bracelets in the workshop and sell them to others for **Stop Hunger Now!**
- 3. OPEL: Ordinary People Extraordinary Lives.** How can you live a transformed and extraordinary life in your ordinary, run of the mill, catch the bus, text your friends, do your homework, go to soccer, practice the piano, take a shower, go to bed day? 180° has ideas and tools you can use (we welcome yours as well) for making life very OPEL.
- 4. Evil Happens:** We see it in our news and our world, in movies and TV. The question is, does evil have the final say? The answer is no! From Newspapers to the Good News, from lifestyles of the rich and famous to Kingdom living, finding the right angle makes all the difference in the world.
- 5. Unadjusted:** Romans 12:3 tells us not to adjust to this world, but to re-adjust to the way God calls us to live. How does this fit with what the world says about money, our bodies, our possessions, and other choices? Do a reality check on our culture, and get unadjusted.
- 6. Transformers:** Hollywood can make cars turn into RIDICULOUSLY cool, life-like heroes and villains! Nettawood will teach us what Romans says about *real* transformers. Come experience how flour, salt, play-doh, seeds, and butterflies can teach even movie makers a thing or two.
- 7. Scrap Exchange:** One person's junk is another person's art. Scraps of everything will be flowing from the tables, hanging from the ceilings, and falling out the doors in this workshop. Your mission is to transform it into art, expressing the life-changing ideas found in Romans 12.
- 8. Direction Correction:** Head up to Massanetta's Ropes Course and outdoor Labyrinth for some walking, some talking, and a whole lot of looking inward and outward. Using both group building and on-your-own activities, find your way with God re-aligned.
- 9. JAM Session:** Making music, listening to music, discussing lyrics, creating instruments—all this and more in our Massanetta JAM session. Music moves us and teaches us. Listen to powerful lyrics that teach and, while you listen, create an instrument of your own. *peacelovenetta*.
- 10. Nobodies Business:** Do you know someone who is considered a “nobody” by others? Whose business is it to help them out? Come find out from unlikely characters in story, music, movies, and TV, how we are called to be somebody to nobodies.
- 11. Makin' T.R.A.K.s - Leavin' T.R.A.K.s:** Have you ever received a “random act of kindness”? Have you ever given one? Doing a 180° is all about changing ourselves by changing our world- one simple act of kindness at a time. “Makin' TRAK's”—the video should hit stores by August.
